# **eco**maine 2010 **eco**-Excellence Awards

#### Summary

Winners were, for the first time, selected by a panel of three judges from the Recycling Committee: Dr. Travis Wagner (Chair), Penny Jordan, and Sarah Bernier.

Each guest received a name tag, an agenda, and a sheet listing contact information for award recipients/nominators. A table with sample materials and program descriptions from various communities was available in the hallway.

Each award winner, nominator and any other supporters were

photographed during the award presentation for use in news releases and as personal mementos for guests (each community received a minimum of two photographs via e-mail).

The Grand Award was presented to the City of Portland's Waste Reduction Group, submitted by Ed Suslovic and accepted by him and fellow Group member Susan Webster (*photo above*). This year Conversion Products (Biddeford) generously donated the plastic "wood" rocking chair that is presented to the Grand Award winner (a \$365 value).

Following the presentations, an informal lunch was served and, then, a "Q & A" exchange. Tours of ecomaine facilities took place after the event and participation was up considerably, compared to 2009.

#### Survey

Event attendance: 108

Surveys mailed (Friday, March 19) to: 70 (55 guests & 15 Board members), which is 65% of all attendees

Surveys returned: 41, which is 59% of those receiving the survey (38% of all attendees)

### There were no\* negative responses in the following areas:

- Parking attendants (\*one "not very helpful")
- Food
- The "Q & A" session (\* one "not of interest")
- Likelihood of nominating someone or group next year

## Venue:

41% said they were "very" or "somewhat" uncomfortable, and 22% said they would rather have more room by moving off-site. 59% said they "didn't think about it" or were "fairly" or "very" comfortable. 66% would prefer that the event remain at **ecomaine**, but comments revealed that it was because of the tours (despite the crowding).

## Format/Organization:

The satisfaction level for the event's format and organization was high with 71% responding that they either "liked it" or thought it was "great"; only 5% replied that it "could be better" and none called it "awful".

71% thought the length of the event was "just about right" and 18% thought it was "a little too long." None replied that it was "much too long."

#### Follow-up Contact:

44% replied that they will "probably" or definitely will contact someone they met at the event; 37% said they didn't know if they would or not. 17% said they either would not or probably would not contact someone.
