PORTLAND, Maine (September 16, 2019) – Today, ecomaine announced its call for proposals for the organization's 2019-2020 round of Recycling Grants, which are designed to raise recycling awareness in schools and communities, and to help schools implement more efficient recycling programs or add composting to their waste collection.

As Maine's pioneer of single-sort recycling and provider of waste-to-energy solutions, ecomaine is pleased to announce that any school from its 70+ member communities can apply for Recycling Grants through October 25, 2019.

"ecomaine's Recycling Grants program is increasingly important," said Kevin Roche, ecomaine's CEO. "It's a big part of our educational outreach portfolio, and it allows students and teachers to work together on some ingenious ways to tackle schools' unique waste challenges."

Criteria could be:

- Use of waste materials (bonus points for non-recoverable/recyclable materials)
 - Should incorporate a "significant amount" of waste material (what IS "significant?")
- Functionality does it work to accomplish something useful?
- Ingenuity looking at waste products a different way

The winning entry will receive \$2,020 for their school's Green Team or Project Graduation. (Funding would be a subset of the budgeted \$25,000 for grants in FY20.)



D2. Metrics: FY19 recaps & July-August 2019

Recyclopedia:

- <u>FY19</u> recap: 159,015 item lookups (vs. 21,867 in FY18) and 3,559 downloads (vs. 1,239 in FY18).
- Downloads to date stand at 3,706 (an increase of 147 in July-Aug.).
- The widget on web pages was viewed 69,323 times, up significantly from June's 60,036.

- The top 10 searches are: plastic bag, Styrofoam, milk cartons, aluminum foil, plastic straws, plastic bottle caps, almond milk cartons, plastic utensils, toilet seats, and alkaline batteries. (Toilet seats are new to the top 10 this month also heavily searched this summer were air conditioners and camping propane tanks.)
