

Finalists Review ecomaine Board April 13, 2023

















Appealing to the environmentally conscious, this garment is made exclusively from retired materials: the base of the jumper formerly belonged to a dress found at Goodwill, and the black straps and bust band came from an old pair of pants.

Even the appliqué on the chest was salvaged from remnants of the designer's upcycled Homecoming dress.

Wearable for any occasion throughout the year, this jumper makes for an iconic runway look.

We made a wind chime because our school used to have one but didn't anymore. We missed it, and that's how we got the idea for a wind chime.
















Students of Jason Lanois, **Windham Middle School**














Sydney Doyle, Mt. Ararat Middle School, Topsham*

My design is a reusable shopping bag. I take feed bags, (from horse grain, chicken feed, dog food, and bird seed) and I upcycle them into durable, wipeable, beautiful reusable bags with canvas handles!

I've made over 200 bags for individuals and organizations such as the Maine State Society for the Protection of Animals.

These bags would normally just be thrown away in dumpsters and not decompose for a long time. Instead, I take them and make them into something useful shopping needs, storage needs, and travel needs.

Manager's Report – Communications & Education Communications, Public Relations, & Education Accomplishments for March 2023

P.R. & Community Outreach...

- Through March 2023, we reached 54,345 people through educational outreach.
 - o FY22 at this point was at 62,694 reached. FY21 was 19,848.
- The Outreach & Recycling Committee awarded 12 eco-Excellence Awards in our in-person ceremony on March 21 – great event with lots of energy and enthusiasm.
- ecomaine's school waste diversion grants are now open for proposals until May 12. We have \$25,000 set aside for the program. The Outreach & Recycling Committee will deliberate proposals at their May meeting. (Current grants have a final reporting deadline of April 30.)
- The Upcycle Challenge has closed, with nine entries received. The Outreach & Recycling Committee will deliberate on these on April 13 to determine finalists, which will then be voted on, online, by the public.
- Legislative/state govt. work continues on LDs 399 (moving to work session), 1171, & 1172 (both hearings on April 5), as well as participation in the DEP's EPR rulemaking stakeholder meetings.
- Staff are working on ecofest 2023, which will be held on Earth Day –
 Saturday, April 22, 2023 at the North Yarmouth Community Center. It
 will take some elements of the annual ecomaine Open House, such as bin
 and other giveaways, information, and exhibitors, and combine them with
 a new location, food trucks, and more.
- Katrina Venhuizen has resigned effective after April 22's ecofest for a
 position with Garbage to Garden. Recruitment is underway for a social &
 digital media specialist, an environmental educator, and new tagging
 interns.

Online & Social Media Metrics...

Recyclopedia:

- In March, the Recyclopedia saw **16,045** items searched. This is significantly lower than March 2022 (61,686), and staff are investigating. The total number of items searched over the lifespan of the database is 1,721,994.
- The widget on web pages was viewed **466,931** times in March on ecomaine's site and others who have embedded it.
- Total app downloads to date stand at **5,466** (an increase of 18 in March.)
- The top 10 searches are: Styrofoam, mattresses, milk cartons, glass olive oil bottles, baby bottles, plastic bags, electronic waste, fiber berry containers, rice cookers, and shower heads.

ecomaine.org:

- Total March web traffic was up 37% compared to February; compared to March 2022, this is up 21%.
- Total Page views increased 18% from February to March; this is down 3% from March 2022.


Social media saw a nice uptick in March, due to posts about eco-Excellence Award winners, which were shared by those participants.


Facebook:

- o Gained 47 new followers in March (3,742 total)
- Our top post in March, with a reach of more than 32,000 users, was a post promoting ecofest.
- o Our average post reach was 2,214 users in March.
- Instagram: We had 41 Instagram posts in March, which had a reach of 44,158. We gained 35 new followers for a total of 2,837.
- Twitter: Twitter has not been as much of a focus this year, with growth on other platforms and uncertainty around the platform's future. With the site rapidly shedding users since Elon Musk's purchase, our audience stayed even at 952. ecomaine had 89 Tweet impressions from only re-tweeting other accounts. (We are holding on to our account for the time being, so impersonators do not take it over, and it may be that the platform rebounds/is re-sold in the future...waiting and seeing.)
